Legislative Update

After the Legislature was finished with their work. the additional support the DD agencies received ended up being a 2% increase for each year of the biennium for inflation. as well as an additional \$1 per hour towards direct and indirect care staff wages. We will be finding out more information in regard to how the additional funding for wages will be applied. While it fell significantly short of what our industry had requested, we are fortunate to have received an increase. We will continue to partner with our local legislators to help them to learn more about the work we do and the difference it makes.

Update on Security Cameras

We have found the use of security cameras in our facilities to be very beneficial from a safety standpoint. We initially used them on an incident-only basis, but have also noted in

our camera policy that cameras will be periodically monitored to check that they are working properly and also as a way to assure policies are being followed. We follow a strict policy regarding privacy of the individuals we serve and keep the camera access very limited. Note that the permissions on cameras are discussed

when individual plans are drafted (or when reviewed) and also require approval by HRC.

Mini-Grants can be used for a variety of needs and must be consistent with the mission of the Envision Committee and DHI as an organization.

Specific Mini-Grant Funding Areas of Interest

Areas of interest that have been identified as priorities include independent living, technology, maximizing individual potential, and training and team building.
